A NEW SACRISTY ROOM FOR ST. DAMIEN PARISH LUDRU

In the year of 2023, a request letter was given to the development office. Fr. Alexis sent the request to Fr. Manoj and he was kind enough to support financially to complete the sacristy room. Now the parish church has a spacious sacristy room to keep all the liturgical items. The sacristy room was blessed on 29th of January. On behalf of the parish and the parish council, I express a deep appreciation and gratitude to Fr. Manoj and to all those who supported the completion of the sacristy room.

ASH WEDNESDAY



Ash Wednesday is the start of Lent season in the Roman Catholic Church. The forty days of lent reminds us of the forty days of rain in Noah's time the forty years the Israelites journeyed to get to the promised land and the forty days Jesus prayed and fasted in the wilderness. All these events represent a time of struggle and purification that people had to go through before they got to something better. The ashes on our foreheads remind us of that call for purification to get to something better. On this day we had the Holy mass at 12: o'clock pm. The main celebrant was Fr. Prem and the con-celebrant by Fr. Arul. In the homily, Fr. Prem beautifully explained the three pillars of Lent fasting, Praying and Almsgiving. Reconciliation is to repair or mend what is broken or divided. To facilitate this process of purification and reconciliation, three things are traditionally suggested Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. In the Gospel, our Lord Jesus explains how these are to be practised. Prayer is about being connected to God even amidst our busy lives. Fasting is all about staying disciplined and saying no to things that take us away from the love of God. Almsgiving is all about seeing God in our fellow brethren, especially those most in need of our help and caring for them. As God says-Though mother forgets her child I will not forget you. After the homily, Father blessed the Ash and put on our foreheads saying "Repent and believe in the good news". Thereafter we proceeded to the main part of the mass. In this Holy season of Lent, we are given a chance to repent from our wrongdoings. At 7: 15 p.m., we had Stations of the Cross. I reflected on each station of the cross that my lord Jesus Christ bore only for my sins but I always go away from Him. As the Church has given us this Holy season let us reflect on it and repent ourselves, do good, and bring our hands together to others those who are in need. Always pray as OUR LORD prayed and fasted in the desert. Last but not the least Lent is not to be limited to doing something, it is rather being with the LORD.
