Trip to Odisha

In the last issue of *Bharat ki Jeewan* we wrote about our 2021 Christmas celebration and other activities in the community. Now, I am happy to report the event on the trip to Odisha by the novitiate community. The main purpose of this trip was to visit the Odisha communities and my family, as part of the novitiate plan.

At dawn on March 1, we, Fr. Felipe and I, began to travel with Fr. Ajith, Regional Superior, who took us in his vehicle to Odisha. We arrived at DSDI at the end of the afternoon (in the middle of the way we were stopped for almost a couple of hours due to



a strike that blocked the road). The next day was Ash Wednesday. We celebrate the Eucharist in the evening, thus facilitating the presence of the Catholics of the area. In the morning, we had visited some non-formal education centers, where the prizes were distributed to the children of the contest that had been held on "Children's Day" and that had to be postponed due to the second wave of Covid-19.

The next day early in the morning I went alone to Berhampur for my LL (bike Learning License) exam. After having finished my LL computer test, fortunately I joined Fr. Felipe who came with Fr. Alexis and one of his social workers to also visit Ludru as part of the preparation of his social projects. When



we arrived in Ludru, one of our parish communities, Fr. Subal and Fr. Robert gave us a warm welcome and we experienced the joy of community. Then the next day we set out to visit some parishioners and parish villages shortly after Holy Eucharist.

On March 5 we travelled to my birthplace, Kasabasa, by public transport. Around half past eleven we arrived at my family's house and began to visit the village: first our chapel, which is named after Saint Patrick, and second the families of the village. Now, it was almost lunch time; we had a sumptuous meal prepared by my family, which was delicious. After lunch, Fr. Felipe talked with my parents about my first profession which I translated from English to Odia and vice versa. After saying goodbye to my family, we returned to Ludru. Father Subal, Father Alexis and the social worker came to fetch us. The next day early in the morning we traveled to Bhubaneshwar.

While staying at DSDI community, we visited Janla (a center for leprosy patients and the mentally ill women run by the MC sisters); Choudwar, one of our leper colonies; in

Bhubaneswar we went to Shanti Rani, the house of our SSCC sisters, and also the SSCC Residence,

currently the Regional House. We also had a tourist visit to the Lingaraj temple (XII century CE). Moreover, on one of the days the fathers the community, who live in Choudwar and at the DSDI, shared their community life with us.

Indeed, it was worth visiting my family after the second wave of Covid-19, as well as the communities. In particular, visiting the community was ideal and important for me to get to know community life in reality. Finally, on March 10, we returned to Kolkata, to our novitiate house in Dangadighila.

. Covid – 19 Ration Distributions

There were 128 beneficiary families who were given out the dry ration of rice, *daal*, atta and refined oil. There was a sense of gratitude expressed to DSDI by the organizing committee of this group of poor and migrant daily labourers.

Felipe Lazcano along with his novice Susanto was on a visit to DSDI community and its ministries, and participated in a few prize distribution programs. Along with prize distribution,



the children/students also performed dances in order to make those distribution days celebratory one.
