Youth Ministry in A Rural Parish

Matthew 18:2-4 says, "He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them and he said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." Because of God's heart for young people, it is important to recognize their value in today's church. It is important for the truth of the gospel to be passed down from generation to



generation in order to help the body of Christ to grow. Ultimately, helping youth to grow spiritually in their formative years will equip them to make an impact for Christ both now and in the future.

My Diaconate ministry started in St. Damien Church, Ludru, a small village in Odisha. The involvement of Diaconate ministry initially began with young people. The purpose of being with young people is to learn a local language and to teach them to grow in the relationship with Christ. This will prepare them to serve the Lord in all they do. My reluctant involvement in youth ministry have become a passion. I knew from much experience that young people are eager and enthusiastic to respond to the call of holiness. But someone has to walk with them. I found that there were many youths in the village but only some were actively participating in the church activities at the beginning. So, every Sunday, after Mass, I began to greet young people and invite them to at least try coming to the youth group. I started to hold youth meetings after Mass every Sunday. We started some youth activities like cleaning the church premises every Saturday and Sunday from 3pm to 5pm. The youths took the initiative to plant seedlings and sow seeds of different fruits behind the church premises. The idea is to raise youth fund in future. As a result, these nurtures the congregation and allows the church to flourish.

Many have encountered great difficulty in coping with the usual daily expenditures as sources of revenue stated dawdling and even drying up totally. At this critical stage, many of our parents had contemplated stopping their children's education as they could not pay their school fees. But we know that education is empowerment, enlightenment, and attainment of knowledge for a complete development of the self.

Hence, as a part of our pastoral plan, under the guidance of Rev.Fr.Sudhir Nayak,ss.cc., our former Priest in-Charge, a committee was formed to explore ways to sponsor our needy children's

education through the Parish Educational Sponsorship Program (PESP). The committee comprised of Rev. Fr.Sudhir (President) Mr. Lucas Gomes (Secretary) Mr. John K. Mondal (Co-ordinator) and Mrs. Celine Gloria David, Mrs. Anila Hembram, Mr Thomas K Abraham and Mr.Ivor Smith (Members).

After a series of meetings, certain guidelines were formulated to highlight the objectives purpose, enlightening our needy children and future fund raising plans. Then Mr. Lucas along with few other members succeeded collecting of amount Rs. 93,000/- as donation from different people. Out of the total amount some amount was spent for the Christmas gift (school bags) for all the children of St.Damien of Molokai Church, Dum Dum.

And on 11 July 2021, under the patronage and whole hearted support and encouragement of our present Priest in-Charge Rev.Fr. Umakant.ss.cc., we were happy to distribute cheques amounting to Rs 2000/- each to fifteen of our children. This was certainly a noble gesture as even in such an unimaginable situation and financial constraints. St. Damein PESP team thanks to all the donors for their generosity. We too hope many more parishioners and other kind hearted people will continue to support this social outreach program to the needy through their unceasing generosity. Thanks to the team for their hard work for this noble cause.
