### SOCIAL RESPONSE TO COVID-19

Damien Social Development Institute (DSDI), through its field staff members has already initiated some activities among the poor, daily migrant workers and leprosy patients who live in urban slums



and colonies in Bhubaneswar and Pipili. Among the activities which have been carried out are: distribution of cooked food among the slum dwellers, door to door health, hygiene and sanitization awareness programs and distribution of about 1500 cotton masks among these slum and colony dwellers. It has reached out to about 340 families in these slums and colonies.

The Pavitra Hrudaya Sangha (SS.CC.) Trust has also made a cash contribution towards SEVA KENDRA, Calcutta in order to respond to the needs of the poor in Kolkata area during this pandemic lockdown.

DSDI also carried out its dry food ration (rice

and dal), masks and soap distribution among the persons affected by Hansen's disease (Leprosy) in

Trinath Leprosy Colony in Choudwar municipality. This colony was part of a housing project for the rehabilitation of persons affected by Hansen's disease and was built by the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts (Fr. Bill Petrie, ss.cc.) in the 1990's. There are about 55 families that are being rehabilitated in the colony. Besides housing project for their



rehabilitation, DSDI has built a Damien Clinic for the treatment of wounds and ulcers of patients.



The relief work was also carried out in Shantidan Leprosy Colony in Khurda and in Gokhibaba Leprosy Colony in Bhubaneswar. We have been serving the patients of these leprosy colonies since 1979 in whatever way we have been able to in the spirit of St. Damien of Molokaithe leper priest. About 75 families were given the food ration of rice and dal (Pulse), masks and soaps. Our PMW staff member Mr. Panchanan joined us as he has been very much in the service of

these God's people whom Damien embraced as his own and become himself one of them.
