

Ever since the seventeenth century, when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque was granted visions of the Sacred Heart and asked to spread this devotion, the Jesuits, represented by her confessor St. Claude de la Colombiere, played a fundamental role in spreading this devotion.

In recent times, one of the most loved and admired Generals of the Society of Jesus, Fr.Pedro Arrupe was instrumental in reviving this devotion, and placing Jesuits once again at the forefront of spreading it. This devotion, according to Fr. Arrupe, was "the centre of the Ignatian experience." It is an "extraordinarily effective means as much for gaining perfection as for apostolic success."

According to one of the visions made to Margaret Mary, Jesus made twelve promises to those who would have a devotion to the Sacred Heart. Of these, one is of special significance. It reads "Sinners shall find in my Heart the source of an infinite ocean of mercy."This promise is totally in keeping with the message of Jesus on every page of the New Testament. Jesus, the revelation of the father's love, was consistent and constant in His message of the unconditional love of god.

What then does the Feast of the Sacred Heart mean for us today? i) The heart is a symbol of the whole person, and so the Sacred Heart of Jesus represents the whole Christ who is, and will always be, unconditional and eternal love.ii) The feast reminds us of the constant care and concern that God has even now for each one of us and the whole Universe. By celebrating the feast, we make present the selfsacrifice of Jesus for all humankind. Our God is God 'with us and for us' (Mt: 1:23). iii) The feast of the Sacred Heart reminds us of the intimate connection between the Sacrament of the Eucharist and devotion to the Sacred Heart. In the Sacrament of the Eucharist, we receive the real, whole and risen Christ, so in the devotion that we profess to the Sacred Heart, we relive this encounter.

The feast is thus not only a privilege and grace, but also carries with it a responsibility. First, the love that we receive from the Sacred Heart of Jesus must be shared with all. Second, the concern that God has for us and our Universe must be a concern which we must show to our world. Third, the intimate connection of the Sacred Heart and Eucharist reminds us that Just as Christ is so easily available to us, we must also be to each other. The Eucharist and the feast of the Sacred Heart ought not to be private and passive devotions, but celebrations that make us ready to reach out in service and availability to anyone who needs us.

BRBC REGIONAL PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING

Held from 26th to 28th of April 2022 at Loreto Convent School Hall, Darjeeling



Seven Bishops and 55 pastoral council members were present for this annual event from all the 8 Dioceses of West Bengal & Sikkim Region. The inaugural programme consisted of lighting of the lamp, meaningful prayer dance, welcome song and warm welcome address by Most Rev. Stephen Lepcha, the Bishop of Darjeeling who hosted the event. Fr. Robert Johnson, the Deputy Secretary of BRBC presented the report of the last meeting held at Seva Kendra Calcutta, on 2nd and 3rd March 2021.

The inaugural Eucharistic celebration was presided over by Most Rev. Salvadore Lopbo, the former President of BRBC. In his homily he shared Pope Francis' dream of having a synodal Church at every level. He emphasized that Synodality begins from within each person. Every person should live in communion, participation and mission.

The theme for the meeting was "Synodality: A New way of being Church in Bengal & Sikkim region." Fr. Michael Sandip Biswas the contact person of the Archdiocese of Calcutta was the Resource Person. The session was moderated by Sr. Sabrina Edwards, IBVM, the Province leader of Loreto Sisters. Fr. Michael in his power point presentation explained in detail the Kairos of the synod 2023, the theology of the synod and its practical implication in the region.

Each of Commissions presented their reports by the respective Secretaries, Directors, and representatives. The second day commenced with the Eucharistic Celebration. Bishop Vincent Aind, Secretary of BRBC offered the Holy Eucharist along with regional Bishops, commission secretaries and participants. He emphasized on the freedom from fear to proclaim God's Word with courage. Mr. Prabin Kumar Barik from UCPI (United Christian Prayer for India) presented the session on the mission and motto of UCPI. He said that he was convinced that the division among the Christians brings harm to the Church therefore being united in Lord's service bears much fruit.



Priestly Ordination of Dn. A. Anthony Jeykumar. Conferred by his Lordship Most Rev. J. Susai Manickam D.D., Bishop Emeritus of Sivagangai, Tamil Nadu On 5th May, 2022 at Our Lady of Refege Church, Poolangudi, .T. Nadu.

Kolkata: Due to massive heart attack on May 27, Fr. Cyril Fernandes, passed away in his residence at Kanchrapara, where he ministered for nearly five years as priest-in-charge.

Rich tributes were paid during the funeral mass on Monday, June 30 at St. John's Church. His Grace, Archbishop Thomas D'Souza and Bishop Emeritus Cyprian Monis of Asansol Diocese were the celebrants at the altar. Fr. Cyril's nephew a Jesuit priest of Jamshedpur province also came to celebrate mass to bid farewell to his uncle Fr. Cyril.

Fr. Cyril was born on March 18, 1961. He was ordained priest on May 6, 1991. His sudden death shocked everyone in the presbyterium.

Fr. Cyril was found dead in his toilet, in the morning, May 27, when the door was pushed open. A parishioner who cooked and kept the house in order said, "I was shocked to find him dead, when the toilet door was opened. This was most shocking for me. I cried bitterly. He worked very hard during previous day. I could never imagine that he is gone now leaving us behind."

As soon as his demise was announced, the WhatsApp messages kept pouring in. Practically all the priests wrote a line or two to express their grief at the passing away of Fr. Cyril Fernandes. He was loved by all priests, religious and the faithful for his simplicity and open heart. He was not afraid to say, " Spade is spade" "what is right is right and wrong is wrong". He did not compromise with his words and actions. He tried to live a life of integrity and faithfulness to God in ministry.


Aa few comments are worth pondering.

"Devasted to hear the sad news of the sudden death of Fr. Cyril Fernandes. I am lost for words", said Fr. Leo Jayraj.

"Very sad news and unlucky to miss such an active priest". Fr. Upendra Nayak.

"Very shocking to hear about the sudden death of Fr. Cyril Fernandes." Fr. Neethi Das.

"Shocking news. We were together at St. Joseph's convent, Chandannagar on Wednesday, May 25 for the Jubilee of the



Cluny sisters. Looked cheerful that day. Sat next to me. Archbishop also met him. Last expected his un-timely death. May his soul rest in peace!" Fr. Joy Cyprian D'Souza.

His Grace, Archbishop Thomas D'Souza paid rich tributes to Fr. Cyril Fernandes during the funeral mass. In his obituary, he gave Fr. Cyril's biography and his commitment to the Church. He was actively involved in the ministry and he would always walk an extra mile. He was deeply motivated by the love of God and the mission he was called to do as a true missionary.

Fr. Cyril's younger sister also paid rich tributes to Fr. Cyril on behalf of the family. She said, "We never thought that he would become a priest, as he had his own ways. He was always very independent. Though he kept his goal alive, he was misunderstood quite often."

Fr. Cyril joined the minor Seminary in 1980 and after his training in Morning Star Regional Seminary, Barrackpore, he was ordained on May 6, 1991. During his 31 years as priest, he had his twists and turn in his priestly journey. Dissatisfied with some of the structures, he wanted his ways to go about in his priesthood. He went to the ashram once to experience Ashram life. He

moved to another diocese for a couple of vears. He served the new diocese Asansol, where his elder brother, Late Fr. Valerian Fernandes also did ministry as Vicar General. After all, those years being away from the home diocese, Kolkata, he thought it would be better for him to continue ministry in the Archdiocese. He came back to serve the Archdiocese. In most of the parishes he was sent, he was made priest-in-charge. He did not mind. This way he did ministry at St. Ignatius' Church, Kidderpore, Sacred Heart Church, Kharagpur, St. Anthony's Church, Kharagpur. At Sacred Heart Church, he was also the In-charge of the Primary School. The teachers loved him for his simplicity and practical ways.

During his last five years of ministry at Kanchrapara, his desire was to start building the Church, after obtaining the permission from the Govt. offices. He lived a simple life and became a friend of all, irrespective of rich and the poor, He was truly a priest of God, a good shepherd of souls. He did smell the sheep wherever he was posted.

His class mate and companion, Fr. Kuriakose paid his tribute to his friend during the funeral mass. He said. "we fought, we argued at times, but we remained good friends all the years in priestly journey." Further he said, "As we know from philosophy, wherever there is smoke there is fire, so also, wherever Fr. Cyril would be, I would also be." It was their bonding friendship. Both understood each other. He also said that very often he was misunderstood by the authorities. Despite all the gossips, he remained guite firm in his views and his focus to serve God in his priestly life.

Soon after the mass, Fr. Cyril's mortal remains were blessed by His Grace, Archbishop Thomas D'Souza, accompanied by Bishop Emeritus Cyprian Monis, he was buried in St. John's cemetery. May his soul rest in peace! "Always loved, never forgotten, and forever missed." "Eternal rest grant unto O Lord! And let perpetual light shine upon him."


